Medicare's Open Enrollment Period

Where can I go for more help?

State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP): Contact your SHIP if you have questions about any notices you receive or have experienced a potential marketing violation. SHIP counselors can help you review your options and pick a plan that meets your needs. SHIP counselors provide trusted, unbiased, and individualized Medicare counseling. Contact information for your local SHIP is below.

Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP): Contact your local SMP if you believe you have experienced a potential marketing violation. SMP team members can help you to prevent, detect, and report potential Medicare fraud, errors, or abuse.

Tips for Avoiding Unwanted Enrollment

Never provide your Medicare information to anyone but your trusted health care providers. Confirm everything that a plan agent tells you before making a final decision about a plan. Ask for everything in writing. Call your doctors to make sure they are in network for the plan you want to join. You can also call your local SHIP for unbiased answers to coverage questions.

- Send you mail
- ✓ Call or email you about other health plans and products, if you are already a plan member
- Schedule an appointment to discuss plan options with you, but:
 - Before the appointment, you must formally decide which topics will be discussed
 - The appointment must occur 48 hours or more after it is scheduled (unless you walk into their office or it's the very end of the Open Enrollment Period)
 - The plan agent must stick to the topics you have agreed on
 - The plan agent may not use your appointment or the time before or after to market or sell plans to other people in your building or neighborhood

- X Call or send text messages, unless you are already a plan member or you gave the plan permission
- Email or call (even if you are a plan member) if you opt out
- X Ask for your personal information or try to sell you a plan at an educational exhibit
- X Approach you in public areas, such as a parking lot or hallway
- X Give prizes/gifts worth over \$15
 - Cannot be in the form of cash
 - · Cannot require enrollment or appointment to get the gift
- Conduct promotional activities worth over \$15 per expected event attendee
- Provide full meals at x sales/marketing events

Medicare's Open Enrollment Period

Considerations when choosing a new plan

Ask yourself the following questions before choosing a Part D drug plan:

- Poes the plan cover all the medications I take?
- Does the plan have restrictions on my drugs?
- How much will I pay for monthly premiums and the annual deductible?
- How much will I pay at the pharmacy (copay/coinsurance) for each drug I take?
- Is my pharmacy in the plans' preferred network? Can I fill my prescription by mail order?
- What is the plan's star rating?
- If I have other drug coverage, will the Medicare drug plan work with this coverage?

Ask yourself the following questions before choosing a Medicare Advantage Plan:

- Mow much are the premiums, deductible, and coinsurance/copay amounts?
- What is the annual maximum out-of-pocket cost for the plan?
- What service area does the plan cover?
- Are my doctors and hospitals in the plan's network?
- What are the rules I must follow to access health care services and my drugs?
- Does the plan cover additional benefits not covered by Original Medicare?
- What is the plan's star rating?
- Will this plan affect any additional coverage I may have?
